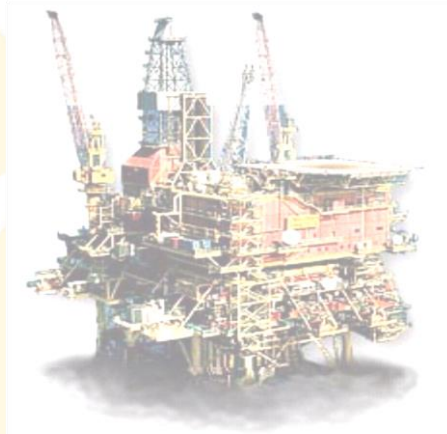

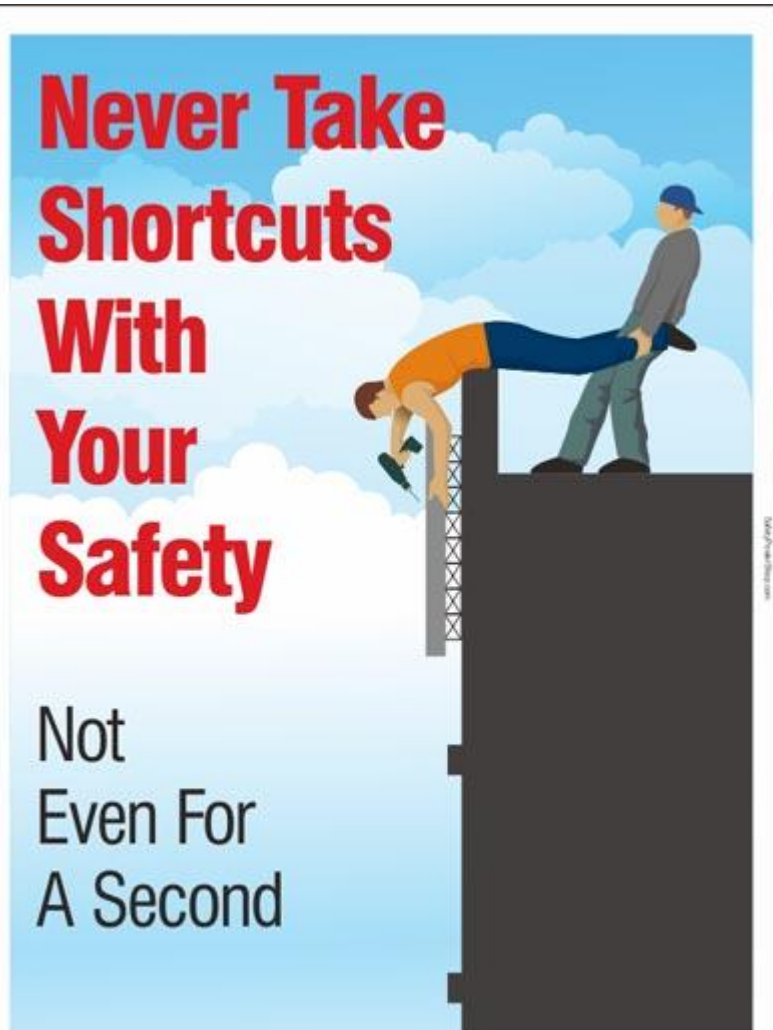

- ☐ Avoiding these behaviours can help prevent accidents and keep you safe on the job.

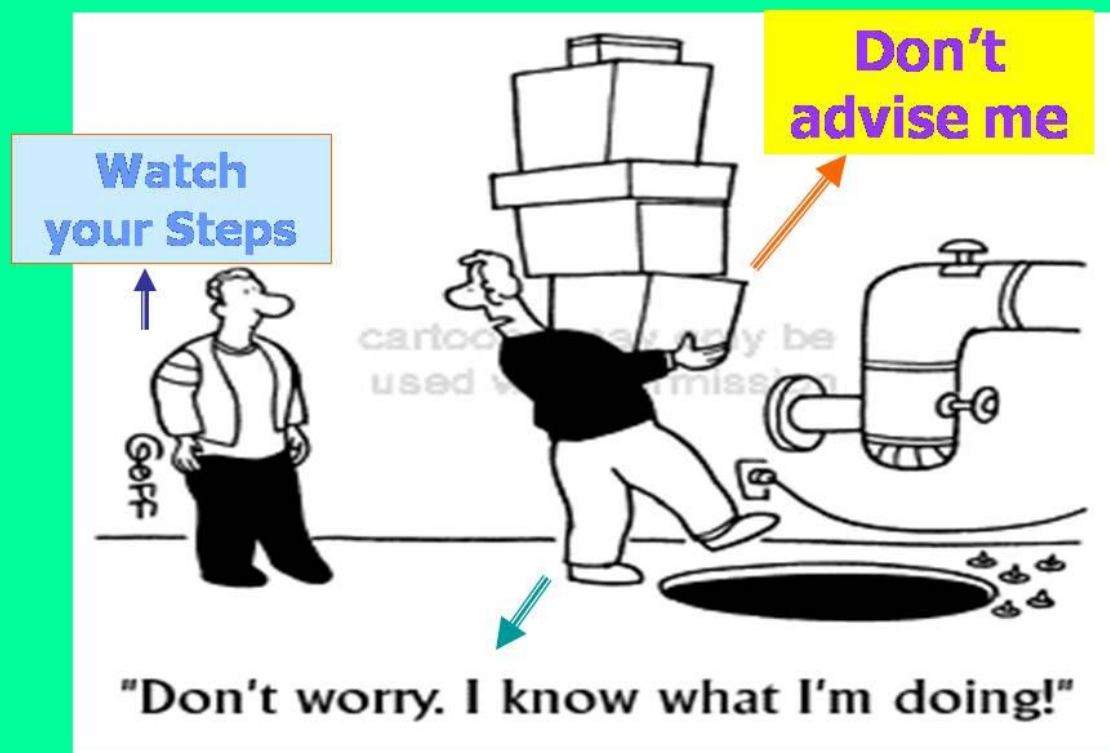
# TAKING SHORTCUTS



- ☐ Every day we make decisions we hope will make the job faster and more efficient.
- ☐ Don't take shortcuts that risk your own safety or that of others.

# BEING OVER CONFIDENT

## Over confidence leads to accident



Confidence is a good thing. Overconfidence is too much of a good thing. **"It'll never happen to me"** is an attitude that can lead to the use of improper tools or methods in your work, which can lead to an injury.



# ***Starting a Task with Incomplete Instructions***

To do the job safely and right the first time you need complete information. Have you ever seen a worker sent to do a job, having been given only a part of the job's instructions? Don't be shy about asking for explanations about work procedures and safety precautions. It isn't dumb to ask questions; it's dumb not to.

# POOR HOUSEKEEPING



- ☐ When clients, Managers or Supervisors walk through a job site, housekeeping is an accurate indicator of everyone's attitude about quality, production and safety.
- ☐ Poor housekeeping creates hazards of all types, while good housekeeping results in a safer workplace.



# IGNORING SAFETY PROCEDURES



- ☐ Purposely failing to observe safety procedures can endanger you and your co-workers.
- ☐ Be sure to always follow company safety policies.
- ☐ Talk to your supervisor if you have suggestions for improving safety policies.
- ☐ Being “casual” about safety can lead to a casualty.



# MENTAL DISTRACTIONS AT WORK



- ☐ Dropping your mental guard can pull your focus away from safe work procedures.
- ☐ Don't become a statistic because you took your eyes off the task at hand "just for a second."





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# OFF THE JOB SAFETY TOPIC

## **Dangers associated with Load shedding:**

- ☐ **Take note of all the electrical appliances that are switched on before the electricity is cut.**
- ☐ **When the electricity goes off, make a point of switching the appliances off (Irons, stoves, etc.)**
- ☐ **Put candles, matches torches or rechargeable lights in strategic areas.**
- ☐ **Consider areas without windows or lights.**
- ☐ **Ensure you have a manual override system for electronic gates and garage doors.**
- ☐ **Consider a delay start timer on compressor loads – fridges and freezers. Voltage level could damage motors.**
