

Incident Learnings - COVID-19 Positive cases

- 11 Cases reported –
 - 3 in Warehouse
 - 5 in Maintenance
 - 3 in Operations

Facts gained:

- All affected persons typically experience symptoms of coughing, fatigue and body aches for a period before they are tested positive.
- The social distancing, sanitising and wearing of masks was adhered by all employees at all times, limiting the business continuity impact
- Workplace cleaning schedules were adhered to at all times.
- Business continuity impact in warehouse and static maintenance

The sources of exposure were mainly related to community or family member transmissions

Sharing the learnings

Learnings:

- The timeous reporting to management and self quarantining of individual limited subsequent transmission.
- Treat all surfaces such as paper, items, tables, doorknobs, phones and keyboards as contaminated.
- People should adhere to the requirements of social distancing, good hygiene and wearing face masks at home and when interacting with people outside of their home environment.
- The compliance to social distancing, good hygiene and the wearing of masks during activities is key in preventing transmissions in the workplace.
- Stock taking involves the handling of items and paperwork amongst team members which can elevate the risk of transmission in the absence of controls.
- Sharing of food in the workplace should not be allowed.
- Decontamination of vehicles should also be applied to private vehicles used in lift clubs.
- Employees must inform their line manager if they experience any Covid-19 related symptoms and NOT enter the workplace before being cleared to do so.
- Employees should avoid any contact with fellow employees when booked off sick.
- When any family member is ill, first inform your line manager for guidance before reporting for work.
